Your workshop was a great addition to our 2011 OMK Career Pathfinders Schedule and provided the teens with the opportunity to learn new skills, while also learning about BRATCON Internet Radio.

As you are aware, most of these 71 military teens were from geographically dispersed communities across Arizona from locations such as Tucson, Phoenix, Casa Grande, Sierra Vista, Yuma to name a few. Some were even from outside Arizona. Their parents are current service members within the United States Armed Forces representing all branches of service—Army, Air Force, Navy, Marines—National Guard, Reserves, and Active military. Many of the teens in attendance have a parent currently deployed overseas, recently deployed, or will be deploying within the next 6-12 months.

2011 OMK Career Pathfinders Camp was a residential (4 days/3 nights) camp on the University of Arizona Campus which provided campers with a college experience and exposure to a variety of post-high school career options & life skills. This camp also served as a positive youth development program designed to support these military youth and enhance their ability to be resilient while their service member may be deployed, about to deploy, or recently returned from deployment and help them learn important life skills related to supporting them through the deployment cycle.
